

Public sector funded by **tax payors**.

Private sector funded by **out of pocket, private insurance, employment health benefit and third party administrators**. Its regulated by Private Healthcare Facilities & Services Act 1998.

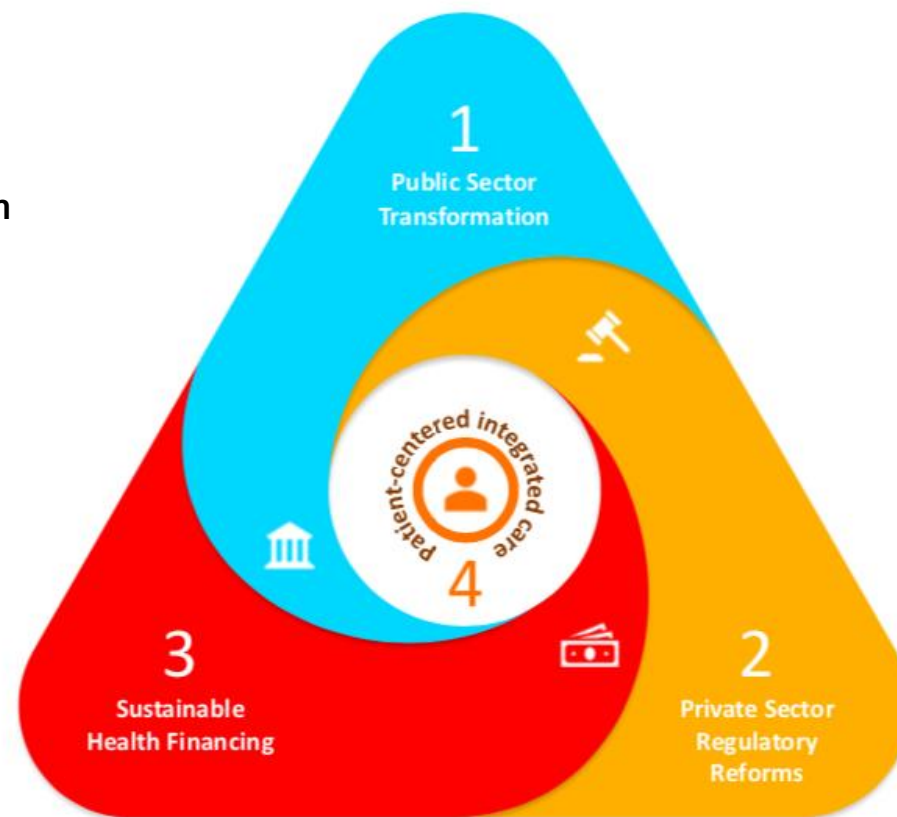


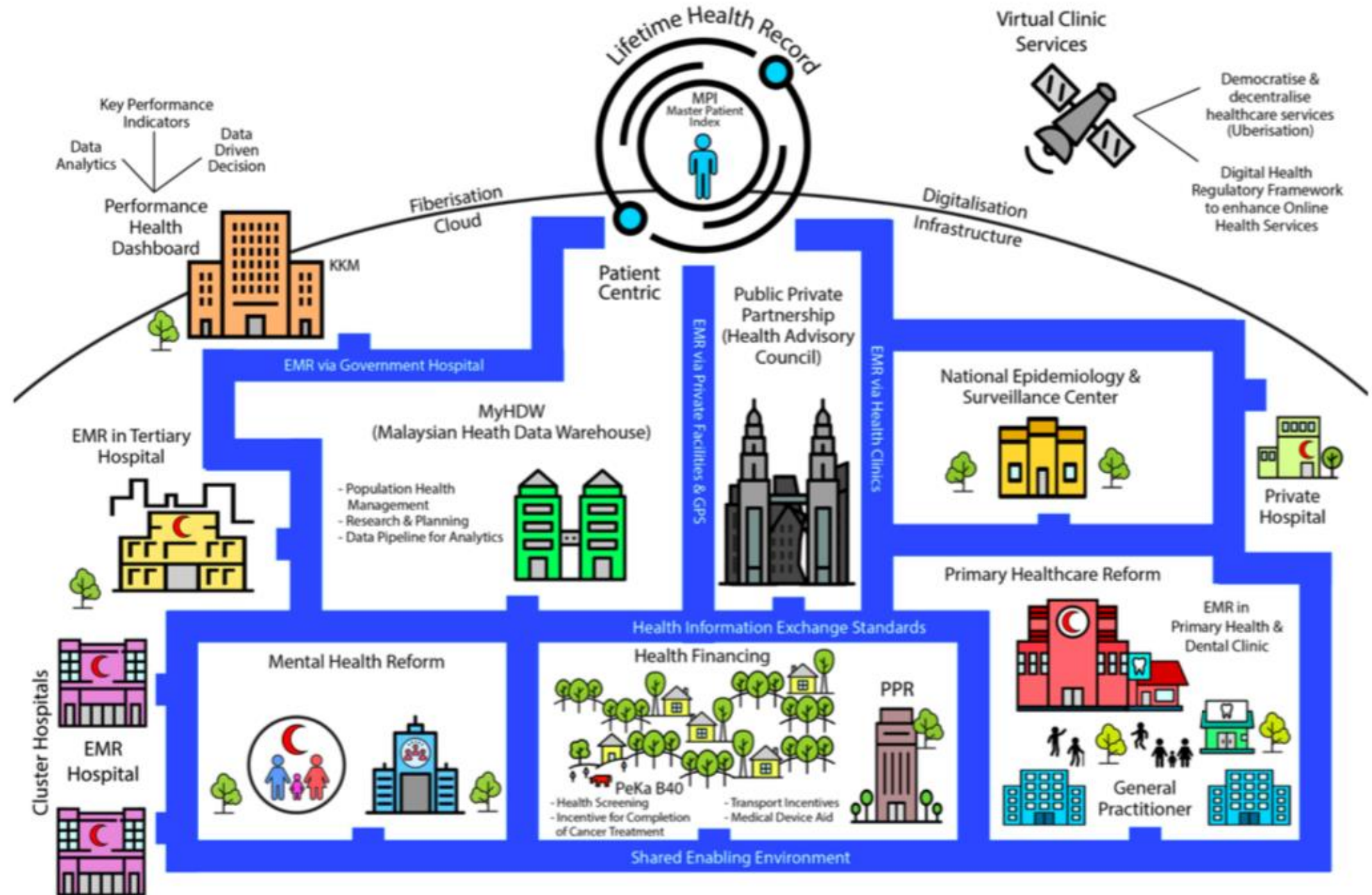

Healthcare Expenditure	RM29.338 billion (51.1%)	RM28.023 billion (48.9 %)

The Total Health Expenditure for 2017 was rm 57.361 Billion. This figure constitute 4.24% of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of which Government Health Expenditure was 51.1 % of Total Health Expenditure which is equivalent to ONLY about 2.25% of GDP. All these are from the Ministry of Health statistics 2017.

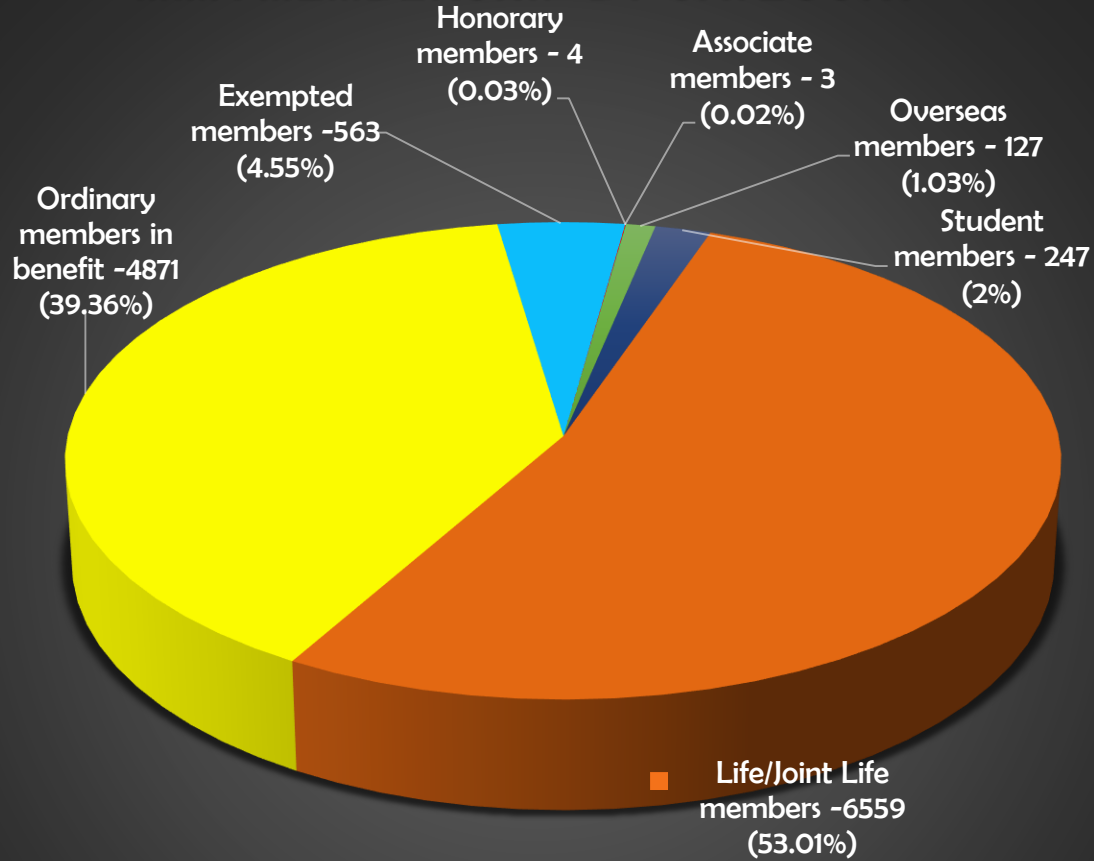
Objectives of Malaysian Medical Association

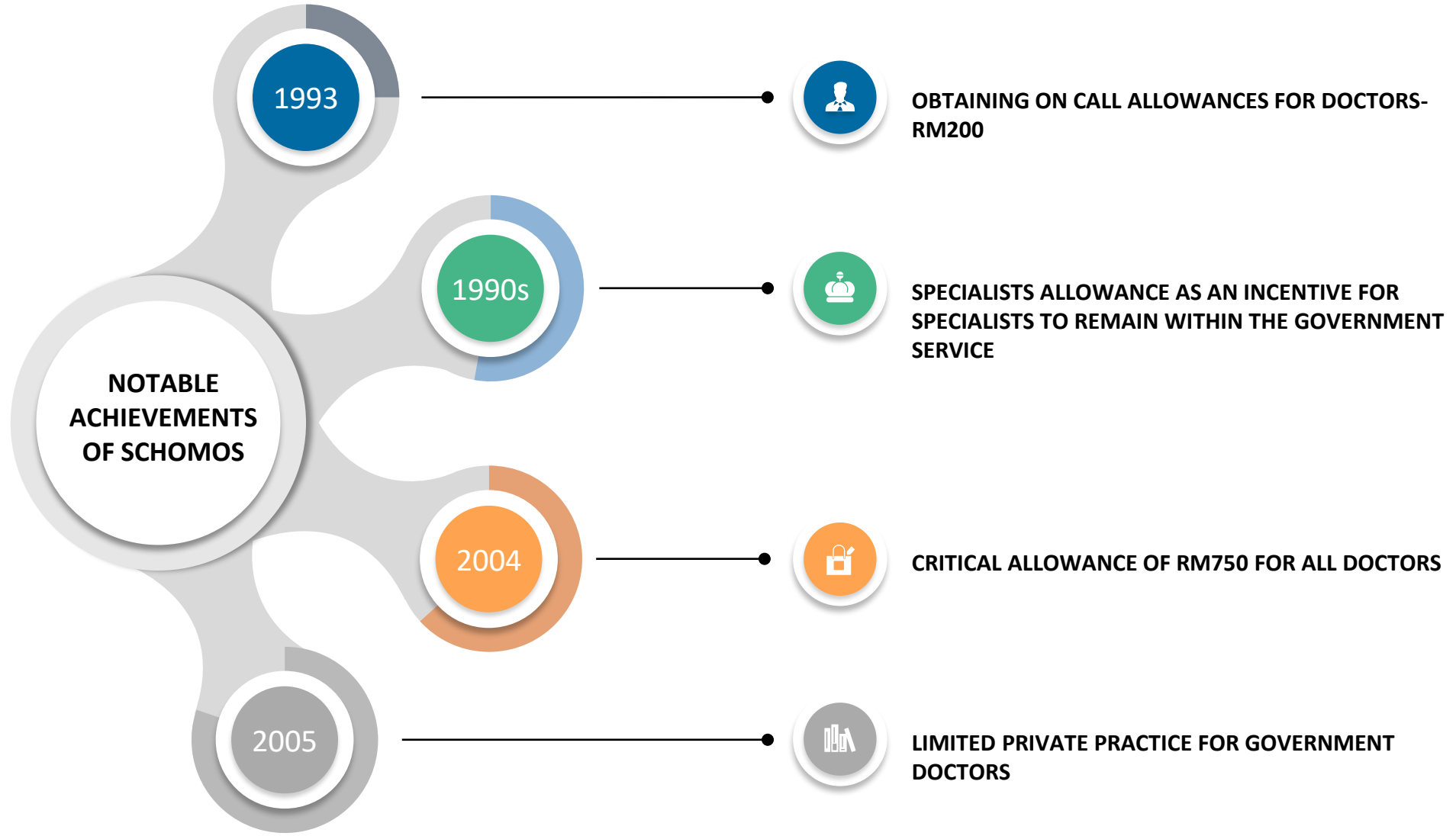


SCHOMOS is the arm within MMA which looks out for the welfare and concerns of the **government employed doctors**.

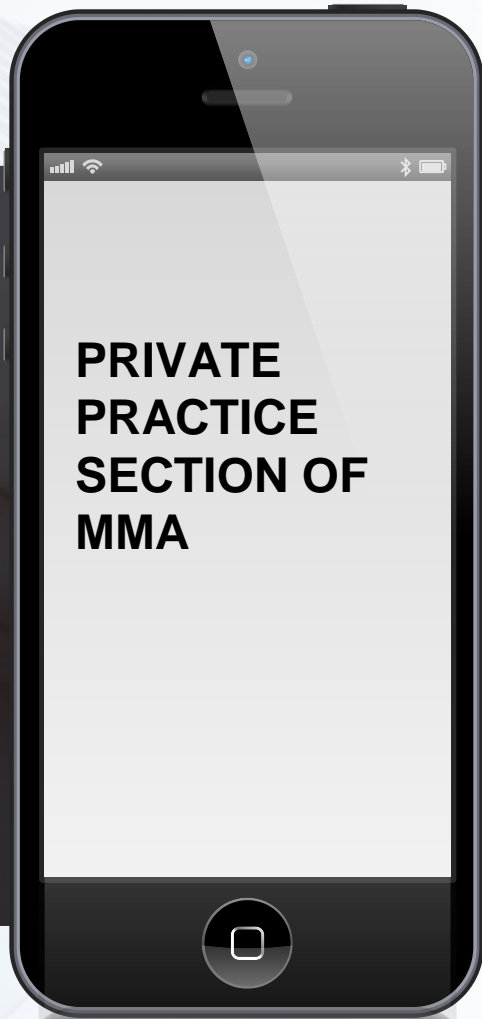

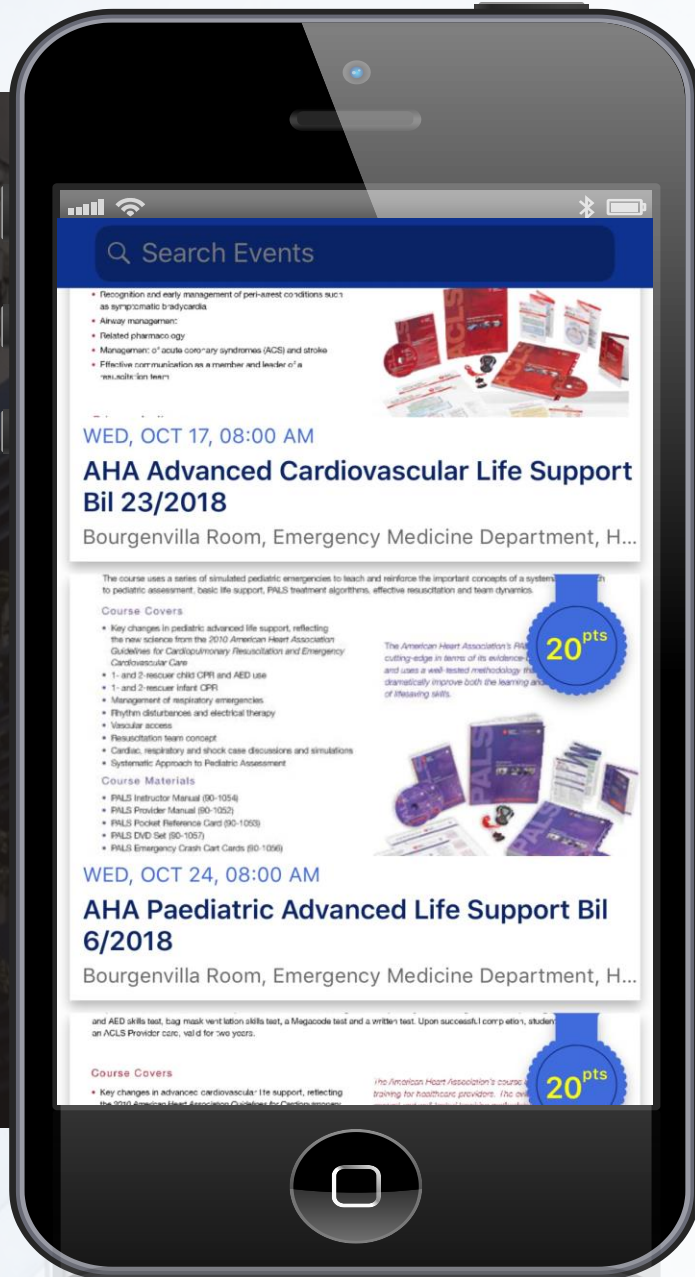
ACHIEVEMENTS BY PPS

PUBLICATIONS



- Appointed by the Malaysian Medical Council to take charge of Continuous Professional Program for Private Medical Practitioners .
- We have developed an app with a QR code, which can be used to record attendance and CPD points and highlights all events registered with MMA.
- More than 24,000 doctors are using the MMA APP.
- Currently we have 327 providers registered with us.
- We approve about 250 events weekly.
