

A Brief Timeline of Local Condition

Key Events:	
2020 Q4	 The fourth wave of COVID-19 outbreak with over 600 cases linked to the dance club cluster Hong Kong's Education Bureau announced the closure of all schools until 2021 Initiative in a mobile app format to track untraceable infections Tightened social distancing restrictions
2021 Q1	 Hong Kong implemented mandatory lockdown in the restricted area Hong Kong Government began the rollout of the mass vaccination program – including SinoVac & BioNTech Release of the 599G Prevention and Control of Disease (Prohibition on Group Gathering) Regulation Suspended operation of the list of scheduled premises, such as Bars and nightclubs
2021 Q2	 The Hong Kong vaccination programme expanded to cover people aged 16 to 29. Kicked off the Outreach Vaccination Arrangement for Residential Care Homes (RCHs) Expanded the vaccination programme to include Mainland residents staying in Hong Kong for a period of time.
2021 Q3	• A number of private firms in Hong Kong offer various lotteries and prizes for Hong Kong residents that have received both vaccination shots.

Prevention and Control of Disease Ordinance (Cap 599)

Cap. 599F (Requirements and Directions) (Business and Premises) Regulation

- The prohibition on group gatherings of more than four persons in listed businesses and premises.
- Persons responsible for carrying on catering businesses and managers of scheduled premises that contravene the statutory requirements under Cap. 599F would have committed a criminal offence.
- Offenders are subject to a maximum fine of \$50,000 and imprisonment for six months.

Cap. 599G (Prohibition on Group Gathering) Regulation

- The prohibition on group gatherings of more than four persons in public places.
- Any person who participates in a prohibited group gathering; organizes a prohibited group gathering; owns, controls or operates the place of the gathering; and knowingly allows the taking place of the gathering, commits an offence.
- Offenders are liable to a maximum penalty of a fine \$25,000 and imprisonment for six months.

Prevention and Control of Disease Ordinance (Cap 599) (Cont'd)

Cap. 599I Prevention and Control of Disease (Wearing of Mask) Regulation

 A person must wear a mask at all times when the person is boarding or onboard a public transport carrier, is entering or present in an MTR paid area, or is entering or present in a specified public place.

Cap. 599J Prevention and Control of Disease (Compulsory Testing for Certain Persons) Regulation

- The Government may specify a person to undergo compulsory testing under the ordinance.
- Such as household members of close contacts of confirmed cases or high-risk groups like border staff.
- The ordinance also empower registered medical practitioners to require, by a compulsory testing direction, any person whom the medical practitioner attends to in the course of professional practice and clinically suspects to have contracted COVID-19 to undergo a COVID-19 nucleic acid test.

"LeaveHomeSafe" Mobile App

- Launching the "LeaveHomeSafe" COVID-19 exposure notification mobile app in mid-November 2020.
- Tapping technology to record visits.
- The app aims to encourage the public to keep a more precise record of their whereabouts.
- Users also receive notification if they were at the same venue at about the same time with a recently confirmed COVID-19 patient.

Border Control and Quarantine Restriction for Inbound Travelers

- The boarding and quarantine arrangements applicable to a person arriving at Hong Kong depend on:
 - Whether the person arriving at Hong Kong is a Hong Kong resident (HKR)
 - What places the person arriving at Hong Kong has stayed in on the day of boarding for/arrival at Hong Kong, or the 21 days before that day
 - Whether the person arriving at Hong Kong is fully vaccinated
 - Whether the vaccinated person possesses positive result proof of a recognised serology antibody test conducted within the past three months (if applicable)

Border Control and Quarantine Restriction for Inbound Travelers (Cont'd)

- All inbound travellers are required to present prior to boarding proof of a negative COVID-19 nucleic acid test result conducted within 72 hours before the aircraft's scheduled departure time and confirmation of a room reservation at a designated quarantine hotel in Hong Kong.
- Upon arrival, they will be subject to the test-and-hold arrangement at the airport. Upon confirmation of negative test results, they must proceed to the designated quarantine hotels for compulsory quarantine via designated transport arranged by the Government.
- The Government has categorised overseas places into 3 different risk groups according to the relevant risk-based boarding and compulsory quarantine requirements.

Border Control and Quarantine Restriction for Inbound Travelers (Cont'd)

Group A (High-risk):

- Only fully vaccinated Hong Kong residents are allowed to board flights for Hong Kong from high-risk places.
- Must undergo a <u>21 day</u> compulsory quarantine and will be subject to 4 tests to be conducted during the period.
- Followed by a 7 day self-monitoring period.
- Compulsory testing on the 26th day of arrival.

Border Control and Quarantine Restriction for Inbound Travelers (Cont'd)

Group B (Medium-risk):

- Only Hong Kong residents and fully vaccinated non-Hong Kong residents are allowed to board flights for Hong Kong.
- Fully vaccinated travellers are subject to a quarantine period of <u>14 days</u>.
- Additionally, travellers who hold proof of a positive serology antibody test result are also allowed to have a shortened quarantine period of 7 days, followed by a 7 day self-monitoring period.

Group C (Low-risk):

• Fully vaccinated travellers from are subject to a quarantine period of <u>7 days</u>.

Exemption: "Return2hk" Travel Scheme

- Return2hk Travel Scheme for Hong Kong Residents Returning from the Mainland or Macao without being subject to quarantine.
- Hong Kong residents under the Return2hk scheme will be exempted from the 14-day compulsory quarantine requirement when returning to Hong Kong from 29 April 2021 onwards.
- Relevant travelers would need to apply for a quota for a specific date and boundary control point. As of 29 July 2021, the daily quotas for the scheme is 5,000.
- Upon their entry into Hong Kong, they must present a valid proof of negative result of RT-PCR nucleic acid test issued by one of the recognised medical institutions.


"Designated Hotel for Quarantine" Scheme

- Fully implemented on 22 December 2020, requiring all arrivals from specified places to undergo compulsory quarantine at designated quarantine hotels.
- The latest cycle (20 June to 31 August, 2021) featured a total of 34 hotels and provided about 10,700 rooms.
- Designated quarantine hotels are required to observe the following strict requirements, including:
 - All designated hotels have to be inspected by relevant departments so as to ensure the design, facilities and operations of the hotels meet the Government's infection control requirements;
 - Designated hotels should not accept non-quarantine guests during the period when joining the Scheme;
 - Public should not be allowed to have access to the hotel premises, except for areas in lobby and carpark which have been properly segregated;
 - Hotels should take all reasonable procedures to ensure that persons undergoing quarantine will not leave their rooms during the quarantine period and no visitations to these persons should be allowed;
 - Hotels should step up cleansing and infection control as well as security arrangements and arrange for its relevant staff to attend COVID-19 test every 7 days.

Community Vaccination Service

COVID-19 Vaccination scheme started in February 2021, providing the public with the following vaccines:

- **1. Inactivated virus technology platform** by Sinovac Biotech (Hong Kong) Limited
- mRNA technology platform by Fosun Pharma in collaboration with the German drug manufacturer BioNTech (BNT162b2 mRNA vaccine)
- The Hong Kong government has established vaccination centers in every districts in Hong Kong with sufficient supply, in order to meet the huge demand of local population.



Community Vaccination Service (cont'd)

- The Vaccination Scheme **has expanded to aged 12-15** on 11 June 2021 to cover teenagers for COVID-19 vaccination.
- On 27 July 2021, the Government launched Walk-in Vaccination Scheme to streamline the reservation process for the elderly.
- To further boosting the vaccination uptakes, on 2 Aug 2021, the Government announced that the following groups would be subject to vaccination in lieu of regular testing.
 - Government employees
 - Hospital Authority staff
 - Elderly home staff
 - Kindergartens, primary, secondary & special school staff
- Under the new arrangement, should the aforementioned personnel choose not to receive vaccination, they must undergo PCR nucleic acid tests every two weeks at their own expense.

Indemnity Fund for Adverse Events Following Immunization with COVID-19 Vaccines

- The Government has set up the Indemnity Fund for Adverse Events Following Immunization with COVID-19 Vaccines (AEFI Fund) to provide financial support to eligible individuals who have suffered unexpected serious adverse events (SAE) associated with a COVID-19 vaccine.
- If an SAE is certified by a Registered Medical Practitioner and the Expert Committee on Clinical Events Assessment Following COVID-19 Immunisation (Expert Committee) has concluded its causal relationship with the vaccination, the Administrator will propose a payout based on the conclusion of causal relationship, the information provided by the relevant medical institutions and the severity assessment scheme.
- As of June 10, 2021, 74 applications for the AEFI Fund were received, 3 cases were approved with a total of HKD \$450,000 allocated.
