

Advocating for the Profession

Health Insurance

SMA, together with the Gastroenterological Society of Singapore and Society of Colorectal Surgeons (Singapore), sent a joint letter to The Straits Times Forum which was published on 28 August 2020, to highlight concerns relating to the exclusion of coverage for diagnostic endoscopies under Integrated Shield Plans (IPs) offered by some insurance companies. We were concerned that denial of coverage for diagnostic endoscopies may lead to diagnostic delays and poorer outcomes.

Disciplinary Process and Informed Consent

SMA has been actively involved in providing feedback on issues related to the disciplinary process and informed consent.

Disassociation with Doctor Directory Website

SMA received complaints from members that their practice particulars were included, without their permission, on the DoctorxDentist (DxD) website. The website publishes doctor directories and purports to offer cost estimates for consultation and/or facilitate booking of appointments to see doctors on behalf of patients.

Membership & Engagement

Supporting Members during COVID-19

COVID-19 came like a fast and furious tidal wave, hitting everyone when we least expected it. With cases rising, protecting our members who were front-line healthcare workers (HCWs) became our priority.

SMA managed to secure supplies of N95 and surgical masks, which were expected to run low due to overwhelming demand, for distribution to members of SMA and College of Family Physicians Singapore (CFPS).

With the generous donation of hand sanitisers by Temasek Foundation and venue support by Singapore Manufacturing Federation (SMF), SMA conducted "Bring Your Own Bottle" (BYOB) Hand Sanitiser Distribution Exercise for registered medical and dental clinics.

Engagement with Student Leaders

SMA had the privilege of working alongside young student members from the three local universities, as well as student members from the Singapore Medical Society of Australia and New Zealand (SMSANZ), the Singapore Medical Society of the United Kingdom (SMSUK), and the Singapore Medical Society of Ireland. Conducted virtually via Zoom, these meetings gave students a safe space to share their challenges and how they coped with changes to their study schedule and practical learning during the pandemic.

Staying Positive for Our Front-liners

2020 was a challenging year for everyone, but it was even more so for HCWs. Not only did they face very real dangers at their workplaces, but they also sacrificed family time with their loved ones and faced discrimination from the public due to fears of cross-contamination. Nevertheless, SMA remained positive and did our best to encourage our members who were in the front-line to keep up their spirit and continue the good fight.

#SGArtforHCW, a social media campaign, was initiated by SMA in February 2020 to galvanise public support for our front-liners through artworks.

On a tangible level, the DIT Committee was able to secure numerous food and beverage (F&B) promotions for HCWs as a way of appreciating them for their sacrifices and hard work.

Members' Appreciation Gift

The SMA annual Members' Appreciation Nite was put on hold in 2020 due to COVID-19 safe-distancing measures. We have specially prepared an SMA mask (or "SMAsk" for short) for our members and volunteers, as a token of our appreciation for their continued support for SMA.

Medicine, Doctors and the Law Series

This is a newly minted educational series comprising six seminars for professional development of medical doctors. Specially designed for doctors above the Associate Consultant level in leadership of teams and departments, this series serves as a useful fundamental course to prepare consultants who may be called upon to sit in judgement of colleagues at inquiries or deal with complaints.


Singapore Medical Journal


Last year, the *SMJ* called for academic papers related to COVID-19. Submitted articles underwent rapid peer review and early online publication upon acceptance. This was in response to a dynamic situation, with rapid emergence of new scientific data.

As the pandemic continues, the *SMJ* has launched COVID-19 Case Files, a new time-limited category for article submissions. We are calling for papers that discuss up to a maximum of three COVID-19 cases that are novel or complex and present diagnostic, therapeutic or management challenges. Contributions will enrich scholarship on this ongoing topic and serve as a reference for local and global researchers.
