

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A PHYSICIAN'S ACT, REPEALING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 2382, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE MEDICAL ACT OF 1959

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Republic Act No. 2382 or "The Medical Act of 1959", as amended by Republic Act Nos. 4224 and 5946 has been the foundation of the medical profession in the country for the longest time. However, the changing times bring about changing demands and developing technologies that require a law that is more appropriate and responsive to current circumstances.

Over the years, dramatic advances in science and technology and various disciplines in medicine have revolutionized the diagnosis, treatment, and management of diseases. The rapid progress of modern medicine dictates the need to upgrade and update the curriculum of the study and practice of medicine. There is an urgent need therefore to update the existing Medical Act of 1959 that has been the standard reference in the country.

Thus, this proposed measure, which was approved by the House and transmitted to the Senate during the 18th Congress, seeks to enact a new Physicians Act that will govern and regulate medical education including internship training, licensure examination and registration of physicians, postgraduate medical education and training, professional practice of medicine, and integration into one Accredited Professional Organization here in the Philippines.

It is not only enough to address their economic concerns by increasing their pay and remuneration but as the government recognizes the very crucial role of physicians in the national health care system, it is also essential that an environment be provided for them where they can further cultivate and enhance their skills and expertise thereby upgrading the standards of their profession.

The proposed Physicians Act promotes the professional services of physicians by ensuring the efficiency and responsiveness of the different aspects of the medical profession: medical education including internship training, licensure examination and registration of physicians, postgraduate medical education and training, professional practice of medicine, integration into one Accredited Professional Organization, and promotion of competence, moral values, and professional

promotion of competence, moral values, and professional standards.

We entrust our health and our lives to our doctors, and it is only proper that we equip them with legislation that will both promote their profession and protect their rights.

To meet the challenges of improving the quality of health care of our citizenry and the imperatives of global competitiveness in medicine, the passage of this bill is urgently requested.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A PHYSICIAN'S ACT, REPEALING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 2382, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE MEDICAL ACT OF 1959

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

ARTICLE I TITLE, POLICY, OBJECTIVES AND ENFORCEMENT

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Physicians Act of 2022".

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. - The State recognizes the vital role of physicians in the preservation, maintenance, safeguarding, treatment, and enhancement of the life, health, and general welfare of the citizenry. The professional services of physicians shall, therefore, be promoted as a regular component of the total health care system.

SECTION 3. *Objectives.* - This Act provides for and shall govern the:

- a) Standardization, upgrading and regulation of the basic medical education, medical internship, and postgraduate medical education and training;
- b) Conduct of the Physician Licensure Examination, and the licensure and registration of physicians;
- c) Supervision and regulation of the practice of medicine;
- Integration of the medical profession under one national professional organization of physicians; and
- Upholding patient welfare and patient safety as the primary consideration in the practice of medicine and promoting competence, moral values, and professional ethics of members of the medical profession.

SECTION 4. Enforcement. For purposes of implementing the provisions of this Act, there shall be created the following: Medical Education Council under CHEd, hereinafter referred to as the MEC; Professional Regulatory Board of Medicine under the Professional Regulation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the PRBM; Postgraduate Medical Education Council under the

The objectives of the INPOP shall be as follows:

- a) Ensure that the high standards of the medical profession are responsive to the health needs of the population;
- Supervise and monitor the education, training, and certification of medical specialists and subspecialists;
- Foster and maintain the high ideals of integrity, competence, professionalism, and compassion;
- d) Provide opportunities for continuing professional development and research:
- e) Serve as the authoritative source of information regarding wellness, health, and disease;
- f) Assist government health agencies in public health policy formulation, implementation, and healthcare delivery, and in ensuring the enactment of just medical laws;
- g) Promote the welfare and protect the legitimate rights and interests of its physician-members;
- h) Promote fraternal relations among physicians, and between physicians and allied health professionals;
- Promote health literacy, provide quality care and dismantle structural inequities that contribute to poorer health in vulnerable communities and the marginalized sectors of the community, and
- j) Advocate for social, economic, educational, and political reforms intended to ameliorate suffering and contribute to the well-being of Filipinos;
- k) Promote the practice of medicine in the context of Philippine life and culture.

Article VIII

Integrated Philippine Medical Association

Section 50. Integration of Physicians. - That the Philippine Medical Association shall be recognized as the accredited integrated association to which all registered physicians shall belong. It shall be recognized by the Board and accredited by the Commission as the one and only accredited integrated association of physicians. Henceforth, all physicians to be registered with the Board shall automatically become members of the accredited integrated Philippine Medical Association upon payment of required fees and dues. Membership in the accredited and integrated national organization of physicians shall not be a bar to membership in other association of physicians.

Section 51. The Integrated Philippine Medical Association (IPMA) shall have perpetual succession and shall have all legal powers appertaining to a juridical person, particularly the power to sue and be sued; to contract and be contracted with; to hold real and personal property as may be necessary for corporate purposes; to mortgage, lease, sell, transfer, convey and otherwise dispose of the same; to solicit and receive public and private donations and contributions; to accept and receive real and personal property by gift, devise or bequest; to levy and collect membership dues and special assessments from its members; to adopt a seal and to alter the same at pleasure; to have offices and conduct its affairs in the Greater Manila Area and elsewhere; to make and adopt bylaws, rules and regulations not inconsistent with the laws of the Philippines; and generally to do all such acts and things as may be necessary or proper to carry into effect and promote the purposes for which it was organized.
